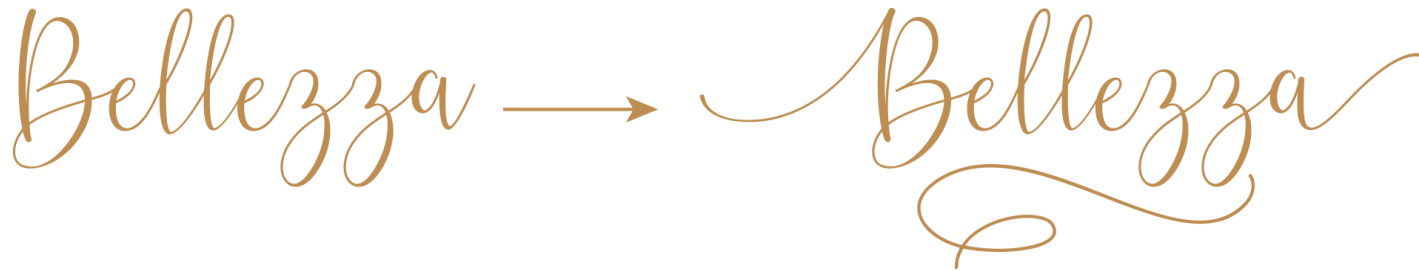

## ACCESS ALTERNATE CHARACTERS

Most of our fonts include a set of stylistic alternates and/or swashes. This allows you to decorate your words in different ways.

See an example of our fonts “Belly Betty” here:

First of all I want to mention, that I highly recommend to use vector software like Adobe InDesign, Adobe Illustrator and Inkscape or Adobe Photoshop.



## **How to access alternate characters in Adobe Illustrator, Indesign and Photoshop**

### **Adobe Illustrator & InDesign**

1. Click on Type” on the top navigation.
2. Click on Glyphs → The Glyphs window will show up.
3. Select your font on the bottom left of the window.
4. Now you can see all chracters of the font. Create a text field and double-click the character you would like to use.

### **Adobe Photoshop**

1. Click on Window on the top navigation.
2. Click on Glyphs → The Glyphs window will show up.
3. Select your font on the top left of the window.
4. Now you can see all chracters of the font. Create a text field and double-click the character you would like to use.



## Other possibilities to access alternate characters

If this does not work because you are working with a very old version of Adobe or don't use Adobe software in general there is another possibility to access the special alternates via separate programs.

### For Mac Users :

1. Open the program "Font Book" (it is already installed on your computer).
2. Select your font.
3. Click on the second button on the top left to show all characters.
4. Just copy the character you want and paste it into your document.

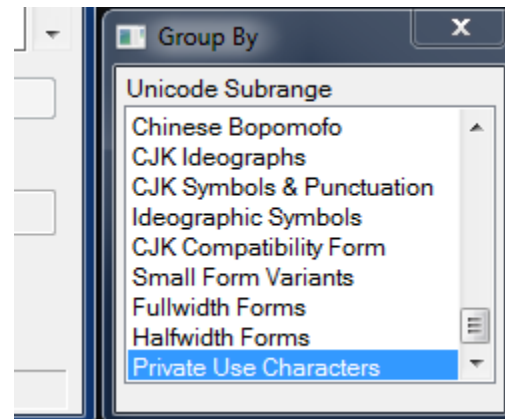
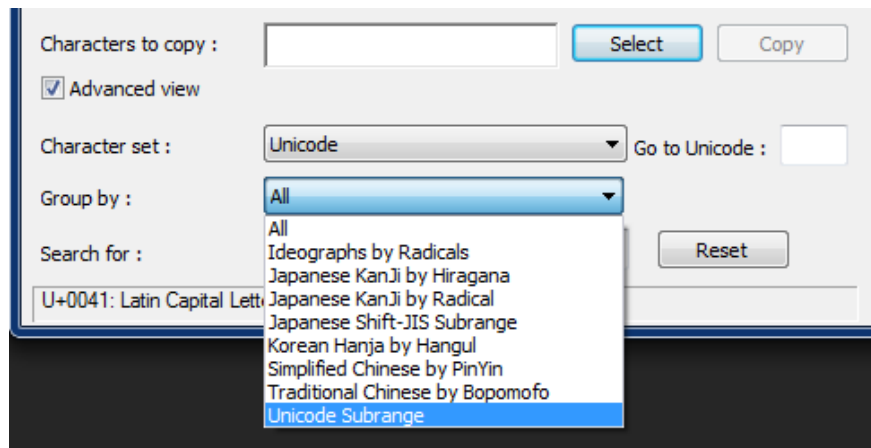


(Because of technical reason the special characters are displayed twice, use the characters at the bottom)

### For Windows Users :

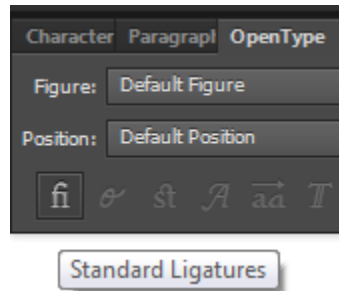
1. Open the program "Character Map" or "Charmap" (it is already installed on your computer).
2. Select your font.

3. Check “Advanced view” on the bottom of the window.
  4. Choose “Unicode Subrang” & by “Group by”.
  5. Another small window will open with the Unicode Subranges.
- Scroll down and select “Personal Use”.
7. Now you can see all alternate characters. Just double-click a letter.
- The letter will show up below, copy it into your document.



## USING LIGATURES

Some of our fonts like “Belly Betty” or “Kagura”. All ligatures are on by default, but usually every text and graphic software includes the function to turn them on. If you are using Adobe Illustrator click on Window → Type → OpenType
